## Dauphin County Drop Off Recycling Centers

In May of 2002, the Dauphin County Board of Commissioners and the Dauphin County Department of Solid Waste Management established the first voluntary Drop Off Recycling Center in Gratz. Not long thereafter, additional Centers were opened throughout the County; and as of 2011, there are 10 Drop off Recycling Centers throughout Dauphin County for the convenience of our residents.

The Drop Off Recycling Centers were partially funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental

Protection’s Act 101, Section 902 grant that was awarded to Dauphin County in 2001.

A copy of the full brochure, which provides drop off locations and a list of accepted materials can be found on page 13 & 14 of the newsletter. The brochure also provides information on where to take electronics for recycling and disposal of Household Hazardous Waste.

Please keep in mind that West Hanover Township has a mandatory curbside recycling program in place.



## Chestnut Oak Recognized as Outstanding Big PA Tree

Another tree located in West Hanover has been recognized as one of Pennsylvania's outstanding big trees. A large chestnut oak located on Arlene Houck's property is recognized as the fourth largest of its kind in the state. To date we have ten trees listed, three of them (including Mrs. Houck's) have been added to the Pennsylvania Forestry Association's Big Tree Listing. Details about our township's Big Tree Registry can be found at the EAC link (under government) at [www.westhanover.com](http://www.westhanover.com). The Forestry Association's list is at [www.pabigtrees.com](http://www.pabigtrees.com).

Anyone may nominate a particularly large, specimen or unique tree for the West Hanover Big Tree Registry. The first step is to secure the permission of the property owner by having them complete and sign the permission for listing form. The completed form may be given to a member of the Environmental Advisory Council, mailed or dropped

off to the EAC at the Municipal Building.

After permission is received, EAC members will contact the owner and arrange for the tree to be photographed. Information will be collected and recorded on the

Pennsylvania Forestry Association's Big Tree Nomination Application. The data will be used to calculate a champion tree point score, which will then be compared with the trees listed on the PA Big Tree website.

Polystyrene #6, **molded packaging and foodservice containers only**, is now being accepted at the Dauphin County Recycling Center at 1620 South 19th Street, Harrisburg, PA 17104.

Recycling Guidelines:

1. Items **MUST** have the #6 recycling symbol on it.
2. All foodservice containers and cups **MUST** be rinsed prior to recycling.
3. Items **MUST** be delivered to Recycling Center in a **CLEAR BAG**.

### West Hanover Township Recycling Guidelines

Jars, bottles, cans and other items should be rinsed to remove food debris. Lids should be removed. Labels do not need to be removed. Do not place items in plastic bags. Flatten cardboard boxes, plastic bottles and cans.

#### What to Recycle at Curbside:

- Aluminum food & beverage containers including foil & pie/baking tins
- Glass food & beverage containers: clear, brown, green. Remove lids.
- Numbered plastic containers (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7) with narrow necks (i.e. milk & water bottles, detergent & shampoo bottles, bleach bottles, etc.); Ferrous (iron, steel, tin) cans
- Black & white newsprint, construction/craft paper, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, printer/computer/copy paper
- Junk mail, magazines, catalogs & phone books; Corrugated cardboard, broken down & flattened. (Do not tie or place in plastic bags)
- Coated milk or juice cartons with peaked top.

#### What NOT to Recycle at Curbside:

- Wax coated paper or cardboard; Plastic bags, Styrofoam; Batteries, light bulbs
- Mirrors, window or auto glass, porcelain, ceramics, microwave oven trays, drinking glasses, perfume/cologne bottles
- Wood or yard waste, unnumbered plastics, coat hangers, wire
- Household items (i.e. toasters, cookware, bakeware). Hazardous or toxic substances or items that have contained them such as paint, glue or petroleum products.

## End of Construction Delays *By Robert Leonard, Zoning Administrator*

As fall approaches so does good news about the completion of the Exit 77 road project along Linglestown Road between Quality Circle and Jonestown Road. All widening and repaving is expected to be completed in November, along with 4 new traffic lights. These new lights will be at both exit ramps from Interstate 81, at the entrance to McDonalds and the T/A Truck Stop, and at a realigned Fairville Avenue and the Wilco Hess Truck Stop and Speedco. For pedestrian safety, new sidewalks have been added along Linglestown Road.

More good news for travelers is the construction and opening of two new Hotels in the Township; one at the intersection of Jonestown Road and Hershey Road, and the other at the intersections of Blue Ridge Avenue and Allentown Boulevard. Both of these facilities should provide additional customers for restaurants and gas stations in the Township. Good Luck to them both.

## Sewer Authority Adopts New Resolution to Deal With Sewer Arrears

### Are you up to date with your sewer bill?

Collecting sewer arrears continues to be a problem for the West Hanover Township Water and Sewer Authority. As of July 1, 2011, the Authority's arrears total \$37,744.77.

The majority of residents pay their sewer bills in a timely manner. The Authority would like to take this opportunity to thank those residents for enabling the Authority to meet its substantial financial obligations each month.

A significant amount of time is spent each month attempting to collect sewer arrears. Some residents do not pay their sewer bills for three, six or even twelve months. Letters are sent to those residents after they reach \$200 in arrears. Sometimes those residents pay their sewer arrears and

within a few months are back on the arrears list and the process to collect the arrears begins again.

In an effort to be fair to all ratepayers, the Authority has decided to take more aggressive steps to collect the sewer arrears in a more timely manner. As a step in that direction, at its meeting on July 19, 2011, the Authority adopted Resolution 2011-A-4. The Resolution sets forth the process to collect arrears in excess of \$200 through an attorney's office. The process will work as follows:

- When sewer arrears reach \$200, a letter will be sent Certified Mail from the Authority Office to the owners of the property advising that if a payment is not made within thirty (30) days, the Authority will assess/impose attorney fees.

- If no response is received after thirty (30) days, the matter will be turned over to the attorney's office for the first demand letter to be sent. At that time, \$250 in attorneys' fees plus filing fees will be added to the total due.
- If no response is received following the first demand letter, the attorney will file a lien and send a second demand letter, prepare and file of Writ of Scire Facias, and have the Writ serviced by the Sheriff. At that time, another \$500 in attorneys' fees plus filing and service fees will be added to the total due.
- If no response is received following the second demand letter, the attorney will mail a

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## State Issues New Rules for Outdoor Furnaces to Reduce Emissions, Protect Air Quality - *Pennsylvania Township News*

Outdoor wood-fired boilers, or OWBs, are becoming increasingly popular for heating homes and water for domestic use and swimming pools. These exterior furnaces are designed to burn clean wood or other solid fuels and are typically installed as stand-alone units or in sheds or garages.

The units are not always popular with neighboring homeowners, however. In fact, the state Department of Environmental Protection, responding to numerous complaints about smoke and other problems with the furnaces, recently published a new rule regulating their use. The regulation will ensure that only the cleanest burning units will be sold in the commonwealth, cutting down on harmful emissions and protecting air quality.

### Hazardous Smoke

Outdoor furnaces sound harmless enough. After all, people use wood stoves to heat their homes and sit around campfires roasting marshmallows. However, OWBs have

proven to be a significant and growing source of fine particulate matter in Pennsylvania.

In 2006, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency amended the national standards for fine particulates, setting the standard at a maximum of 25 micrograms per cubic meter over a 24-hour period. Two years later, all or part of 23 counties in Pennsylvania exceeded the standard. Fine particulates have been shown to contribute to serious health issues, such as lung disease, asthma, aggravation of respiratory and cardiovascular disease, and even premature death.

Tests conducted by the Northeast States for Coordinated Air Use Management show that the average outdoor wood-fired boiler produces emissions equivalent to those from 205 oil furnaces or as many as 8,000 gas furnaces. Cumulatively, the smallest OWB can emit nearly 1 1/2 tons of particulates each year. Of the estimated 155,000 outdoor furnaces sold nationwide, 95 percent have been

sold in 19 states including Pennsylvania.

### Setting the Rules

The DEP rule applies to anyone who sells, leases, or distributes an outdoor wood-fired boiler for use in Pennsylvania; anyone who installs an OWB in the state; and anyone who purchases, receives, owns, uses, or operates an outdoor furnace in the commonwealth.

The regulation states what kind of OWBs can be sold in the state, where they can be installed, and what can be burned in them.

The rule requires that outdoor furnaces sold in Pennsylvania after May 31, 2011, must be EPA-qualified Phase 2 units, which burn 90 percent cleaner than older units. They must also be installed at least 50 feet from the nearest property line and be equipped with a permanently attached smokestack that extends a minimum of 10 feet above the ground.

notice of intent to enter the judgment, with the appropriate documentation, and proceed to prepare the praecipe to enter the judgment and file the same to enter judgment. At that time, another \$500 in attorneys' fees plus filing fees and court cost will be added to the total due.

- If no response is received after the above process, the attorney will prepare paperwork to begin Sheriff's Sale of the property. At that time, another \$2,175 in

attorneys' fees, filing fees, court costs, and advanced sale costs to the sheriff is added to the total due.

Therefore, it is possible to incur up to, and perhaps exceed, \$3,425 in total attorney fees, filing and service fees, court and sheriff's sale costs, if the collection activities reach the point of a Sheriff's Sale.

We would encourage anyone in arrears \$200 or more to contact the Authority Office at 540-0124, Monday through Friday, 8 AM to 4 PM, to make arrangements to bring their arrears up to date.

The Authority is willing to work with residents who are experiencing employment issues, health issues, etc. Those types of issues will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Failure to deal with the arrears will result in action taken as described above.

The rule also dictates what fuels may be used in OWBs, including clean wood, wood pellets, and home heating oil, natural gas, or propane that is used as a supplemental starter fuel.

Non-Phase 2 furnaces purchased up to

May 31 must be installed a minimum of 150 feet from the nearest property line and have a smokestack at least 10 feet high.

Although DEP's rule does not impose restrictions on when OWBs may be used, townships may impose restrictions that are more stringent

than the department's.

**Reminder to Residents with On Lot Septic Systems:** The Township Code of Ordinances, Chapter 158-9 requires all on lot septic systems to be pumped at least once every four years. Please be sure your pumper/hauler forwards a copy of the pumping report to the Township Codes Office.

**Animals Running At Large/Disturbing the Peace:** Residents who own pet animals are reminded that the Township's Animal Control Ordinance prohibits domestic pets from running at large upon the property of another person or upon public streets and properties. The Ordinance also prohibits animals from disturbing the peace by making loud, harsh noises which disturb or interfere with the peace, quiet or rest of another person.

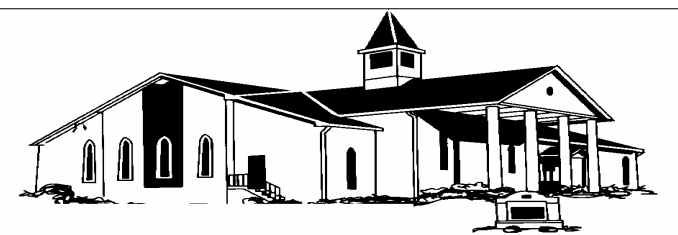
